(a) When from all the circumstances the court is of the opinion that any accused person in a criminal case will appear as required for trial either before or after his conviction, the person may be released on his own recognizance, UNLESS THE COURT MAKES A FINDING UNDER § 616 1/2(K) OF THIS ARTICLE, THAT THE RELEASE OF THE DEFENDANT WILL PRESENT A THREAT TO THE SAFETY OF ANY OTHER PERSON OR THE COMMUNITY. If any person by corrupt means or by threats or force endeavors to influence, intimidate, or impede any juror, witness, or court officer of any court of this State in the discharge of his duty, or by corrupt means or by threats or force obstructs, impedes, or endeavors to obstruct or impede the due administration of justice therein, he is liable to be prosecuted, and on conviction to be punished by fine not exceeding \$10,000, or by imprisonment not exceeding [3] 5 years, or both, according to the nature and aggravation of the offense.
