

**Article 19 - Comptroller**

20.

The bonds of ALL REGISTERS OF WILLS AND all OTHER officers and employees of the State, or of any agency of the State, shall be made to the State and, with the exception of the bond of the State Comptroller, EACH such executed [bonds] BOND shall be filed with the State Comptroller after such approval [and recording thereof] OF THE BOND as may be prescribed by statute. All such bonds may be submitted by the said Comptroller to the Office of the Attorney General for approval as to form and legal sufficiency.

**Article 24 - Political Subdivisions - Miscellaneous Provisions**

11-504.

(q) (2) The County Commissioners shall appoint a dog warden and may appoint deputy wardens. The dog warden and any deputies appointed shall serve at the discretion of the County Commissioners and shall be paid whatever salary and allowances for travel the Commissioners prescribe. Before entering upon the duties of the office, the dog warden and any deputy dog wardens appointed shall give bond to the State with good and sufficient surety, to be approved by the Commissioners, in whatever penalty the Commissioners determine and conditioned on the faithful performance of duties and proper accounting for all moneys and property received by virtue of the position. The bond shall be in the form of a "public employee's faithful performance blanket bond" for the dog warden and all deputies, if possible. The premiums shall be borne by Calvert County, and the bonds shall be filed [and recorded in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of the County] WITH THE STATE COMPTROLLER.

**Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings**

2-105.

[(g) The bond of every officer, except an officer who serves an appellate court or who is covered by a blanket bond, shall be recorded in the office of the clerk of the circuit court and every bond, except a blanket bond, shall be filed with the Comptroller.]

2-310.

(b) Immediately upon assuming the powers of the sheriff, the second in command shall file a bond with the [clerk of the court of Baltimore City or of the county] STATE COMPTROLLER, in the same penalty and on the same conditions as that required of the sheriff.

**Article - Education**

6-110.

(a) This section does not apply to Baltimore City.

(b) A county superintendent and any other employee of a county board who handles funds of the school system shall give bond to the State in the penal sum required by the county board.
