

4. THE BOARD SHALL KEEP ALL CRIMINAL RECORDS IN A SEALED ENVELOPE AVAILABLE ONLY TO THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD AND THE CLERK TO THE BOARD.

5. THE HEARING FOR A NEW APPLICANT AND THE ISSUANCE OF A LICENSE MAY NOT BE DELAYED DUE TO THE FAILURE OF THE F.B.I. TO PROVIDE THE REQUESTED CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK BY THE DATE OF THE SCHEDULED HEARING.

[(vi)](VII) The respective [board] BOARDS shall destroy the records obtained under subparagraphs (ii), (iv), [and] (v), AND (VI) of this paragraph upon completion of its necessary use of the records;

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1993.

AN ACT concerning

Prince George's County - Transfer Tax — ~~Maximum Rate~~

PG 405-93

FOR the purpose of ~~repealing~~ *extending* a certain termination date applicable to a certain increase in the maximum allowable transfer tax in Prince George's County; requiring that transfer tax revenue be used for certain educational purposes; reducing the maximum allowable transfer tax over several years; providing for a certain exemption; making stylistic changes; and generally relating to the authorization for a transfer tax in Prince George's County.
