Article 89 - Miscellaneous Business, Work, and Safety Provisions

- (c) The Secretary of Personnel is authorized and empowered to designate those bona fide administrative, executive, and professional employees, SUBJECT TO THE SECRETARY'S CLASSIFICATION AND SALARY AUTHORITY, who shall not be eligible to receive overtime compensation but who may be compensated by compensatory time. The Secretary of Personnel is authorized and empowered to adopt and promulgate reasonable regulations to prevent an abuse of this section by the granting of unnecessary and unwarranted overtime or by the failure to grant overtime compensation when the employee is eligible to receive it under the provisions of this section.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - State Personnel and Pensions

6 308.

- (a) The Secretary, by regulation, may:
- (1) designate employees, SUBJECT TO THE SECRETARY'S SALARY-SETTING AUTHORITY, WHO ARE in administrative, executive, or professional positions [who] AND are not entitled to overtime compensation; and
- (2) provide that the designated employee may receive compensatory time for overtime work.

6-309.

- (a) The Secretary may designate, SUBJECT TO THE SECRETARY'S SALARY-SETTING AUTHORITY, those bona fide administrative, executive, and professional employees who may not receive payment for overtime work, but who may be granted compensatory time for overtime work.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 1 of this Act shall take effect July 1, 1993, and remain in effect until October 1, 1993.
- SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take effect October 1, 1993.
