- (i) In Worcester County, the Board of License Commissioners may revoke or suspend an alcoholic beverages license if the license has not been placed in operation after a period of 6 months from the date the Board approved:
  - (1) The issuance of the-license; or
  - (2) The transfer of the license.

- (a) [In] THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY IN Frederick County.
- (B) (1) [notwithstanding] NOTWITHSTANDING any other provision of this subtitle, the privilege conferred by every class of "on-sale" license may be exercised during the hours from 6 a.m. to 2 a.m. [, except on] DAILY, EXCEPT SUNDAYS.
- (2) ON Sundays, [when] the hours [shall be] ARE from 1 p.m. to 2 a.m. [Provided, however, that nothing in this].

- (ii) The special Sunday opening permit authorizes the holder to sell beer, wine and liquor for off-premises consumption on Sundays from 1 p.m. to 12 o'clock midnight.
- (iii) The annual fee for the special Sunday opening permit is \$650 in addition to the annual fee for the Class A beer, wine and liquor (off-sale) license.
- (iv) The special Sunday opening permit is not considered a separate class of license and, if it is granted, the privilege shall be incorporated into the existing Class A beer, wine and liquor license.
