130.

- (a) (1) In Worcester County it is unlawful for any licensee under this article to employ any person under the age of 18 years in the sale of alcoholic beverages, unless a permit is obtained from the Sheriff and State's Attorney of Worcester County.
- (2) Except for events catered by a licensee holding a caterer's license a retail alcoholic beverages licensee in Worcester County may not deliver any alcoholic beverages outside of the licensed premises.
- [(d)](B) Any person [or persons, upon indictment and conviction of violation of any of] WHO VIOLATES the provisions of this section[,] shall be fined [a sum not in excess of two hundred dollars (\$200.00)] NOT MORE THAN \$200 or [shall be confined in the Worcester County] SENTENCED TO jail [or in the Maryland House of Correction for a period not to exceed] FOR UP TO one year, or be both fined and imprisoned[, in the discretion of the court].

## [(b)] 130A.

- (A) [It is unlawful for any] A licensee under this article [to allow] MAY NOT PERMIT any person not designated under § 2(t) of this article to loaf or loiter about the place of business for which the license is issued. [; restaurants]
- (B) RESTAURANTS may, however, serve meals without alcoholic beverages to any person.
