In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 291.

This bill would alter the funding mechanism for the Maryland Egg Inspection Program. The bill would also increase and impose certain fees for the Egg Inspection Program.

House Bill 627, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 27, 1993, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 291.

Senate Bill No. 291

AN ACT concerning

Maryland Egg Law — ~~Restaurants Exempt from Registration and Fees~~

FOR the purpose of exempting ~~restaurants and other eating places from certain registration and fee requirements under the Maryland Egg Law~~ certain persons and facilities from certain requirements and fees under the Maryland Egg Law; altering certain fees; requiring shell eggs for sale to meet certain standards; requiring certain information on a certain invoice; requiring certain packers and distributors to keep certain records on shell eggs for a certain period, to make certain reports, and to pay a certain fee based on a certain ratio; providing a certain penalty; defining certain terms; describing a certain fund; providing for certain effective dates; and generally relating to the regulation of shell eggs.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Section 4-301, 4-302, 4-305, 4-308, and 4-311.2
