(d) (E) Any person who consumes any alcoholic beverages on any premises enumerated in this section and any owner, operator, or manager of those premises or place who knowingly permits the consumption prohibited by this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and may be fined not more than \$1,000 \$5,000 OR IMPRISONED FOR NOT MORE THAN 3 YEARS OR BOTH.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1993.

AN ACT concerning

Vehicle Laws - Width Limitation

FOR the purpose of altering the overall width limitation for a motor home or travel trailer that may be driven on certain highways in the State; and generally relating to the width of certain motor homes and travel trailers that may be driven on certain designated highways in the State.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
