(4) A TEMPORARY PENDING EMPLOYEE.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language added for clarity in accordance with long-standing Departmental understanding and administrative practice.

As to temporary pending employees, who are subject to certain provisions contained in Title 4 of this article (i.e., § 4–306) but are not ordinarily considered to be classified service employees, see Small v. Secretary of Personnel, 267 Md. 532, 536 (1973).

TITLE 2. DEPARTMENT OF PERSONNEL.

SUBTITLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

2-101. DEPARTMENT ESTABLISHED.

THERE IS A DEPARTMENT OF PERSONNEL, WHICH IS A PRINCIPAL DEPARTMENT OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT.

2-102. SECRETARY OF PERSONNEL.

(A) POSITION AND APPOINTMENT.

THE HEAD OF THE DEPARTMENT IS THE SECRETARY OF PERSONNEL, WHO SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE.
