- (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE PERIOD OF PROBATION FOR A POSITION IN GRADES 7 THROUGH 12 OF THE PAY SCALE MAY NOT EXCEED 6 MONTHS.
- (2) SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE SECRETARY, THE APPOINTING AUTHORITY MAY EXTEND AN EMPLOYEE'S PERIOD OF PROBATION UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION FOR ONE ADDITIONAL PERIOD NOT EXCEEDING 6 MONTHS.
  - (D) SAME GRADES 13 AND ABOVE.

THE PERIOD OF PROBATION FOR A POSITION IN GRADE 13 OF THE PAY SCALE OR HIGHER MAY NOT EXCEED 1 YEAR.

(E) SAME — LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES.

EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY LAW, THE PERIOD OF PROBATION FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES OF THE MARYLAND STATE POLICE AND THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES SHALL BE AS PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION.

REVISOR'S NOTE: Subsection (a)(1) of this section is new language added to reflect the authority of the Secretary to establish periods of probation within the maximums set by statute. See COMAR 06.01.01.37C.

Subsection (a)(2) of this section is new language added to clarify the effective date for the pay grades indicated in this section.
