(2) EACH ADDITIONAL 5 YEARS OF SERVICE.

TITLE 9. SEPARATIONS.

SUBTITLE 1. REJECTIONS DURING PROBATION.

9-101. SCOPE OF SUBTITLE.

THIS SUBTITLE APPLIES ONLY TO CLASSIFIED SERVICE EMPLOYEES.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language added for clarity.

Unclassified service employees serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority and do not have probation periods set by statute or regulation.

9-102. REJECTIONS ALLOWED.

(A) IN GENERAL.

EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 9-103 OF THIS SUBTITLE, AN APPOINTING AUTHORITY MAY REJECT A CLASSIFIED SERVICE EMPLOYEE AT ANY TIME DURING PROBATION BY NOTIFYING THE SECRETARY IN WRITING OF THE REJECTION AND THE REASON FOR IT.

(B) EFFECT OF REJECTION.

WHEN REJECTED, THE EMPLOYEE IS PERMANENTLY SEPARATED FROM THE POSITION.
