- (e) (1) With the advice of the Commission, the Director may employ deputy directors and other staff in accordance with the State budget.
- (2) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH-(3)-OF THIS SUBSECTION OR OTHERWISE BY LAW, THE STAFF OF THE COMMISSION IS IN THE CLASSIFIED SERVICE OF THE STATE PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM.
- (3) A deputy director IS IN THE UNCLASSIFIED SERVICE OF THE STATE PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM. HOWEVER, A DEPUTY DIRECTOR may be removed ONLY for cause after [the deputy director is] BEING given [: (i)] notice [;] and [(ii)] an opportunity for a hearing.

(c) The State Supervisor of Assessments and the assessment area supervisors ARE IN THE UNCLASSIFIED SERVICE OF THE STATE PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM. HOWEVER THEY shall hold their positions during good behavior, and may be removed from their positions only after a hearing before the Department and a finding of incompetency or other cause.
