

(2) ADVOCATE THE OVERTHROW OF THE GOVERNMENT BY UNCONSTITUTIONAL OR VIOLENT MEANS.

REVISOR'S NOTE: Chapter \_\_\_\_\_, Acts of 1993, which enacted Division I of the State Personnel Article, also enacted this section, which is derived without substantive change from former Art. 33, § 28-1(1) and (2), as those items related to employees of local entities.

In item (2) of this section, the conjunction "or" is substituted for the former conjunction "and" to clarify that advocating the overthrow of the government by either unconstitutional or violent means is prohibited.

13-106. PENALTY.

ANY PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF THIS TITLE IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND, ON CONVICTION, IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$3,000 OR IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 6 MONTHS OR BOTH.

REVISOR'S NOTE: Chapter \_\_\_\_\_, Acts of 1993, which enacted Division I of the State Personnel Article, also added this section to adopt the penalties specified in SP § 14-201, which apply to Title 3, Subtitle 2 of the State Personnel Article, the State-employee counterpart to this title.
