(3) Unless otherwise provided by law, the Secretary shall appoint and remove all other staff in the Office of the Secretary-in-accordance with the PROVISIONS OF THE State PERSONNEL ARTICLE [Merit System Law] THAT GOVERN CLASSIFIED SERVICE EMPLOYEES.

8-206.

- (a) [The] EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY LAW, THE executive director may employ a staff in accordance with the State budget AND THE PROVISIONS OF THE STATE PERSONNEL ARTICLE THAT GOVERN CLASSIFIED SERVICE EMPLOYEES.
- (a) (1) The executive director may employ a staff in accordance with the State budget.
- (2) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY LAW, THE STAFF IS IN THE CLASSIFIED SERVICE OF THE STATE PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM.

11-205.

(a) (2) The executive director IS IN THE UNCLASSIFIED SERVICE OF THE STATE PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM AND serves at the pleasure of the Secretary.

11 - 206.

(a) With the approval of the Commission and EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY LAW, subject to the [merit system] PROVISIONS OF THE STATE PERSONNEL ARTICLE THAT GOVERN CLASSIFIED SERVICE EMPLOYEES, the Executive Director shall appoint a staff of the Commission.

## **Article – Corporations and Associations**

11-201.

(c) The Attorney General also shall appoint an assistant securities commissioner who, after appointment, shall hold [his] THAT position subject generally to the provisions of DIVISION I OF THE STATE PERSONNEL Article [64A of the Code]. If a vacancy occurs in the position of assistant securities commissioner, the vacancy shall be filled by a person appointed by the Attorney General subject to the provisions of DIVISION I OF THE STATE PERSONNEL Article [64A of the Code]. Each person appointed shall hold his position subject generally to [the] THOSE provisions [of Article 64A].

## Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings

1 - 703.

(a) [Section 27, Article 64A of the Code] TITLE 6, SUBTITLE 1 OF THE STATE PERSONNEL ARTICLE applies to judicial salaries, except for [its] THE provisions OF § 6-108(C) OF THE STATE PERSONNEL ARTICLE authorizing [emergency salary] PAY increases with approval of the Board of Public Works.
