(b) (3) [Unless otherwise provided by law, and except] EXCEPT as provided in paragraph (5) of this subsection OR OTHERWISE BY LAW, the Secretary shall appoint and remove all other staff in accordance with the provisions of the [State merit system Law] STATE PERSONNEL ARTICLE THAT GOVERN CLASSIFIED SERVICE EMPLOYEES.

(5) All personnel in the Department, Grade 18 and above, who administer or direct a program, shall:

(i) Be [exempt from the State Merit System] IN THE UNCLASSIFIED SERVICE OF THE STATE PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM; and

(a) The Secretary shall appoint a State registrar of vital records, who shall be in the classified service [under the State Merit System Law] OF THE STATE PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM.
