

(b) If an individual has failed to renew a license for any reason and then applies to the Board for reinstatement more than 5 years after the license has expired, the Board shall reinstate the license only if the individual:

(1) meets the renewal requirements for that license under § 4-310 [or § 4-311] of this subtitle;

(2) pays to the Board a reinstatement fee established by the Board in accordance with § 4-206 of this title, in addition to the renewal fee required under § 4-310 [or § 4-311] of this subtitle; and

(3) [for a master barber license,] passes the [practical part of the master barber] examination [given] REQUIRED by the Board.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1994.

CHAPTER 20

(Senate Bill 112)

AN ACT concerning

Cosmetology – Practice by Public School Students

FOR the purpose of requiring that a senior cosmetologist supervise the cosmetology services provided by certain students enrolled in public school courses in cosmetology and authorized to practice cosmetology without a license; and generally relating to the practice of cosmetology by certain students enrolled in public school courses in cosmetology.

Annotated Code of Maryland

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Business Occupations and Professions

5-303.

(a) Subject to the provisions of this section, a student who has completed at least 1,000 hours of training while enrolled in public school courses in cosmetology may practice cosmetology without a license.
