- (b) A juror shall receive the per diem amount stated in this section for each day the juror attends court as a juror in:
- (14) Howard County \$10 expense money plus an additional \$10 expense money if the service of the juror extends past 1:00 p.m.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the implementation of this Act is contingent on the [establishment of] CLERK OF THE CIRCUIT COURT FOR HOWARD COUNTY ESTABLISHING a 1 day – 1 trial jury system [by the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Howard County] OR A SYSTEM UNDER WHICH A PROSPECTIVE JUROR IS NOT REQUIRED TO BE ON CALL FOR MORE THAN 2 CONSECUTIVE WEEKS, and if the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Howard County does not establish [a 1 day – 1 trial jury] EITHER system, this Act may not be implemented.
