

(iii) Forward the completed affidavit to the [Child Support Enforcement Administration] DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE, DIVISION OF VITAL RECORDS. THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE, DIVISION OF VITAL RECORDS SHALL MAKE THE AFFIDAVITS AVAILABLE TO THE PARENTS, GUARDIAN OF THE CHILD, OR A CHILD SUPPORT ENFORCEMENT AGENCY UPON REQUEST.

(4) An institution, the administrative head of the institution, the designee of the administrative head of an institution, and an employee of an institution may not be held liable in any cause of action arising out of the establishment of paternity.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the provisions in Sections 1 and 2 of this Act shall be construed only prospectively and may not be interpreted to have any retroactive effect on any child support orders issued or modified before the effective dates of this Act.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if any provision of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any reason in a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or any other application of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and for this purpose the provisions of this Act are declared severable.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 1 of this Act shall take effect July 1, 1994.

SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take effect October 1, 1994.

CHAPTER 114

(House Bill 760)

AN ACT concerning

Lead Poisoning Prevention Program

FOR the purpose of establishing the Lead Poisoning Prevention Program in the Department of the Environment; specifying properties subject to this Act; exempting certain properties from this Act; establishing the Lead Paint Poisoning Commission, its duties and membership; establishing a Lead Poisoning Prevention Fund; requiring the Commission and the Department of the Environment to adopt certain regulations; establishing a certain risk reduction standard standards for affected properties; requiring owners of certain affected properties to register those properties with the Department; requiring owners of certain affected properties to satisfy certain risk reduction standards at certain times; specifying the method methods for satisfying the standard standards; requiring owners of affected properties to provide for certain inspections under certain circumstances; authorizing the Department to provide oversight for lead-contaminated dust testing and inspection and to spot-check compliance; requiring the Department to make
