(c) The Commission:

- (1) at least 15 days before the hearing, shall have notice of the hearing published in at least 1 newspaper with a substantial circulation in the county where the track is located; and
- (2) shall try to give notice of the hearing to any public unit or private organization that has made a written request for notice.
- (D) (1) IF THE TRANSFER OF RACING DAYS FROM ONE TRACK TO ANOTHER BECOMES NECESSARY DUE TO FIRE, FLOOD, MECHANICAL FAILURE, OR ANY OTHER SIMILAR CIRCUMSTANCE DEEMED BY THE COMMISSION TO CONSTITUTE AN EMERGENCY:
- (1) (\underline{I}) THE RACING DAYS MAY BE TRANSFERRED IMMEDIATELY; AND
- (2) (II) AS SOON AS PRACTICABLE, THE COMMISSION SHALL PROVIDE NOTICE OF A HEARING AND CONDUCT A HEARING PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION.
- (2) AS SOON AS THE TRACK AND THE FACILITIES OF THE LICENSEE FROM WHICH RACE DAYS WERE TRANSFERRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SECTION ARE IN A CONDITION TO CONTINUE RACING AND PARI-MUTUEL BETTING, ANY REMAINING DAYS OF THE MEET THAT WAS BEING CONDUCTED WHEN THE DAYS WERE TRANSFERRED SHALL BE HELD AT THE TRACK FROM WHICH THE DAYS WERE TRANSFERRED.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1994.
