- (a) (1) The Commission-shall consist of [seven] NINE members, SEVEN OF WHOM ARE appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate.
- (2) Of the seven members APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR, four shall be individuals who do not have any connection with the management or policy of a health care provider or payor.
- (3) THE SECRETARY AND THE INSURANCE COMMISSIONER SHALL BE EX OFFICIO VOTING MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION.
 - (b) (1) The term of a member is 4 years.
- (2) A member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
