

(I) (1) THE BOARD SHALL ENSURE THAT THE TUITION AND FEES CHARGED TO STUDENTS BY ANY PARTICIPATING INSTITUTIONS ARE REASONABLE.

(2) THE BOARD MAY ALSO CHARGE REASONABLE FEES TO COVER THE OVERHEAD COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH PROVIDING THESE PROGRAMS.

(J) THE BOARD MAY SUE AND BE SUED.

(K) THE BOARD MAY MAKE AGREEMENTS WITH THE FEDERAL, STATE, OR COUNTY GOVERNMENTS OR ANY OTHER PERSON, IF IT CONSIDERS THE AGREEMENT ADVISABLE FOR THE OPERATION OF THE CENTER.

(L) THE BOARD MAY ADOPT A CORPORATE SEAL.

(M) IN ADDITION TO OTHER REPORTS THAT MAY BE REQUIRED BY THE COMMISSION, THE BOARD SHALL:

(1) KEEP RECORDS THAT ARE CONSISTENT WITH SOUND BUSINESS PRACTICES AND ACCOUNTING RECORDS USING GENERALLY ACCEPTED ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES;

(2) CAUSE AN AUDIT BY AN INDEPENDENT CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANT TO BE MADE OF THE ACCOUNTS AND TRANSACTIONS OF THE CENTER AT THE CONCLUSION OF EACH FISCAL YEAR; AND

(3) FOR ANY STATE MONEYS, BE SUBJECT TO AN AUDIT BY THE ~~DIVISION OF AUDITS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FISCAL SERVICES, IN ACCORDANCE~~ OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE AUDITS, IN ACCORDANCE WITH §§ 2-1215 THROUGH 2-1222 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE.

(N) THE BOARD SHALL ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH ST. MARY'S COUNTY TO ESTABLISH GUIDELINES FOR THE USE AND OPERATION OF THE CENTER.

(A) THE BOARD SHALL APPOINT A DIRECTOR OF THE CENTER.

(B) THE DIRECTOR SHALL:

(1) REPORT DIRECTLY TO THE BOARD;

(2) RECOMMEND THE APPOINTMENT BY THE BOARD OF EMPLOYEES NECESSARY FOR THE EFFICIENT ADMINISTRATION OF THE CENTER;

(3) RECOMMEND THE DISCHARGE OF EMPLOYEES FOR GOOD CAUSE AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAWS AND POLICIES;

(4) BE RESPONSIBLE TO THE BOARD FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE CENTER AND FOR ITS ADMINISTRATION AND SUPERVISION;

(5) ATTEND ALL MEETINGS OF THE BOARD, EXCEPT THOSE INVOLVING THE DIRECTOR'S PERSONAL POSITION; AND
