(i) On the land or such portion of the land acceptable to the Trust; and

- (ii) On the exterior and interior, where appropriate, of the historic structures.
- (b) The easement easements must be in form and substance acceptable to the Trust and the extent of the interest interests to be encumbered must be acceptable to the Trust.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1994.

CHAPTER 350

(House Bill 1519)

AN ACT concerning

Harford County - State's Attorney's Salary Office

FOR the purpose of altering the salary of the State's Attorney for Harford County on a certain date; providing that this Act does not apply to the salary or compensation of the incumbent State's Attorney; repealing a requirement that the salary of a deputy State's Attorney in Harford County be at least a certain amount; altering certain provisions relating to the appointment of assistant State's Attorneys in Harford County; clarifying language and structure; and generally relating to the State's Attorney of Harford County.
