CHAPTER 406

(House Bill 1110)

AN ACT concerning

Prince George's County - Alcoholic Beverages (Micro-Brewery License)

FOR the purpose of including Prince George's County among those jurisdictions in which the Comptroller may issue a micro-brewery alcoholic beverages license; clarifying language; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Prince George's County.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

5.

- (i) (1) A Class 7 [Baltimore City] micro-brewery (on- and off-sale) license shall be issued:
 - (i) By the State Comptroller;
 - (ii) Only in THE FOLLOWING JURISDICTIONS:
 - 1. Baltimore City; [or]
 - 2. Dorchester County; AND
 - 3. PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY; and
- (iii) Only to a holder of a Class B beer, wine and liquor (on-sale) license that is issued for use on the premises of a restaurant located in [Baltimore City or Dorchester County] THE JURISDICTIONS NOTED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH.
 - (2) A holder of a Class 7 micro-brewery license:
 - (i) May brew and bottle malt beverages at a single location; and
- (ii) May not brew more than 10,000 barrels of malt beverage each calendar year.
- (3) (i) The on-sale privilege authorizes the holder to sell at retail beer brewed under this license to customers for consumption on the licensed premises.
