SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Agriculture

11-204.

(d) [(1)]The Secretary [may] SHALL conduct inspections AS PROVIDED IN A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING on behalf of and in coordination with other agencies when performing weights and measures inspections AT GASOLINE RETAILING OPERATIONS [, in the interest of reducing duplication of efforts and reducing the overall costs of administration of inspection programs to the State].

[(2) The Secretary shall develop, in cooperation with the Secretary of the Environment and the Comptroller of the Treasury, a coordinated program for inspecting gasoline stations for compliance with weights and measures under Title 11 of this article, for compliance with ambient air quality standards adopted under Title 2 of the Environment Article, and for compliance with gasoline motor fuel specifications under Title 10 of the Business Regulation Article.]

Article – Business Regulation

10-203.

(a) The Comptroller periodically shall collect or cause to be collected and cause to be analyzed samples of all motor fuel that is:

- (1) subject to regulation under this title; and
- (2) stored and offered for sale in the State.

(b) [Samples of motor fuel shall, to the extent practicable, be collected in conjunction with weights and measures inspections conducted by the Department of Agriculture, in accordance with § 11-204(d) of the Agriculture Article.] THE COMPTROLLER SHALL CONDUCT INSPECTIONS AS PROVIDED IN A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ON BEHALF OF AND IN COORDINATION WITH OTHER AGENCIES WHEN COLLECTING MOTOR FUEL SAMPLES UNDER THIS SECTION.
