Article - State Finance and Procurement

4-402.

- (a) (1) Except as provided in § 4-409 of this subtitle, this subtitle does not apply to any public improvement made by:
 - (i) the Department of Transportation or a unit in that Department;
 - (ii) any housing authority created under-Article 44A of the Code;
 - (iii) the Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission;
 - (iv) the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission;
 - (v) the Baltimore County Metropolitan District; or
- (vi) a county, municipal corporation, or unit of a county or municipal corporation.
- (2) Except as provided in §§ 4 406, 4 410, and 4 410.1 of this subtitle or as otherwise provided by law, the University of Maryland System, MORGAN STATE UNIVERSITY, and St. Mary's College of Maryland are subject to the provisions of this subtitle.
- (b) The Board of Public Works may exempt specific projects of a unit of the State government from the provisions of this subtitle.
- (c) The Board of Public Works shall adopt regulations in accordance with Title 10, Subtitle 1 of the State Government Article establishing procedures for the exemption of specific projects of units of State government under subsection (b) of this section.

4-410.

- (a) This section applies to any public improvement project of the University of Maryland System AND MORGAN STATE UNIVERSITY.
- (b) For purposes of this section, the University of Maryland System consists of the constituent institutions and centers specified in § 12-101 of the Education Article.
- (c) In this section, "University" means the University of Maryland System AND MORGAN STATE UNIVERSITY.
 - (d) For any public improvement project regardless of the source of funds:
- (1) architectural and engineering services shall be procured in accordance with Title 13, Subtitle 3 of this article;
- (2) for architectural and engineering services costing more than \$100,000, the Department shall make a recommendation for the award of a contract;
- (3) for architectural and engineering services costing less than \$100,000, the Department shall make the procurement;
