

(1) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE SECRETARY OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES ~~MAY~~ SHALL ASSESS REASONABLE FEES A REASONABLE FEE NOT TO EXCEED \$4 FOR EACH VISIT BY A PRISONER TO A MEDICAL UNIT, PHYSICIAN, DENTIST, OR OPTOMETRIST FOR HEALTH CARE SERVICES PROVIDED TO PRISONERS HOUSED IN ANY CORRECTIONAL FACILITY WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT.

(2) THE SECRETARY MAY NOT ASSESS A FEE UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION FOR HEALTH CARE SERVICES THAT ARE:

(I) REQUIRED AS A PART OF THE INTAKE PROCESS;

(II) REQUIRED FOR AN INITIAL PHYSICAL EXAMINATION;

~~(III) INITIATED BY A HEALTH CARE PROVIDER WHO PROVIDES HEALTH CARE SERVICES TO INMATES WHO ARE IN THE CUSTODY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES, INCLUDING ANY REFERRAL FROM ONE HEALTH CARE PROVIDER TO ANOTHER OR A REQUIRED FOLLOW-UP VISIT;~~

~~(III) DUE TO A REFERRAL BY A NURSE OR PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT;~~

~~(IV) INITIATED, AS A FOLLOW-UP VISIT, BY A MEDICAL PROFESSIONAL FROM THE CORRECTIONAL FACILITY;~~

~~(V) (I) REQUIRED FOR NECESSARY EMERGENCY TREATMENT;~~
OR

~~(V) REQUIRED FOR PREGNANCY DIAGNOSIS, PRENATAL CARE, OR FAMILY PLANNING.~~

~~(VI) INITIATED BY A MEDICAL OR MENTAL HEALTH STAFF MEMBER OF THE CORRECTIONAL FACILITY.~~

(2) (3) THE SECRETARY OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT AND COLLECT THE FEES AUTHORIZED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1994.
