the signs remain posted for a certain period after the application; making certain stylistic changes; and generally relating to pesticide applicators.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Agriculture

5-206.

- (a) The Secretary shall establish, by rule or regulation, qualifications for licensing and certification in each category established by § 5-207 to assure competence and responsibility in the application of pesticides.
- (b) The Secretary may issue licenses, permits, and certificates only to an applicant who meets the requirements established by the Department.
- (c) The Secretary may establish the conditions under which licenses, permits, and certificates may be revoked [or], suspended, REINSTATED, OR RENEWED.
- (d) The Secretary may establish minimum requirements for financial responsibility for all damages which may be incurred in the commercial application of pesticides.

## 5 207:

- (a) (1) Each pest control consultant, pest control applicator, or public agency applicator shall obtain an annual certificate indicating competence in one or more established categories from the Secretary.
- (2) Each private applicator shall obtain a certificate which shall require periodic renewal as determined by the Secretary.
- (b) (1) Each application for a certificate by a pest control consultant or pest control applicator shall be accompanied by a \$50 certificate fee plus \$25 for each category in excess of one.
- (2) Each application for a private applicator certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of \$7.
