**CHAPTER 555**

**(House Bill 347)**

AN ACT concerning

**Crimes and Punishments – Burning on Property**

FOR the purpose of ~~prohibiting the burning of objects or causing objects to be burned on certain property without consent by the property owner or without notification of a certain fire department~~ repealing an unconstitutional provision of law concerning burning of crosses and religious symbols; prohibiting the burning or attempted burning of objects on the property of persons and institutions under certain circumstances; providing the State Fire Marshal and certain assistants with arrest power for certain types of hate crimes; defining a term; and generally relating to burning of objects on certain properties.
