- (B) (2) THIS <u>SECTION</u> <u>SUBSECTION</u> DOES NOT APPLY TO A COIN MACHINE OPERATOR OR LOCKSMITH WHO, IN THE ORDINARY COURSE OF BUSINESS, POSSESSES A LOCK PICK DEVICE.
- (C) (3) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS <u>SECTION</u> SUBSECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$1,000 OR IMPRISONMENT FOR A TERM OF NOT MORE THAN 90 DAYS OR BOTH.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article 27 – Crimes and Punishments

35.

- (a) (1) A person may not possess burglar's tools with the intent to use or permit the use of the tools in the commission of any crime involving the breaking and entering of a motor vehicle.
- [(b)](2) A person may not be in or on the motor vehicle of another with the intent to commit theft of the vehicle or property that is within the vehicle.
- [(c)](3) A person who violates this [section] SUBSECTION is guilty of a misdemeanor, shall be deemed a rogue and vagabond, and on conviction is subject to imprisonment for not more than 3 years.
- (B) (1) A PERSON MAY NOT POSSESS A DEVICE, COMMONLY KNOWN AS A LOCK PICK, THAT IS MANUFACTURED OR DESIGNED TO DEFEAT A LOCK ON A COIN MACHINE, AS DEFINED IN § 340(A) OF THIS ARTICLE, WITH THE INTENT TO DEFEAT A LOCK ON A COIN MACHINE.
- (2) THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A COIN MACHINE OPERATOR OR LOCKSMITH WHO, IN THE ORDINARY COURSE OF BUSINESS, POSSESSES A LOCK PICK DEVICE.
- (3) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SUBSECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$1,000 OR IMPRISONMENT FOR A TERM OF NOT MORE THAN 90 DAYS OR BOTH.
- SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if Chapter \_\_\_\_\_ (H.B. 471/S.B. 322) of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1994 becomes effective, Section 1 of this Act shall be null and void without the necessity of further action by the General Assembly, and if Chapter \_\_\_\_\_ does not become effective, Section 2 of this Act shall be null and void without the necessity of further action by the General Assembly.
