

(4) The Commission shall promptly notify the victim or the victim's designated representative of the decision of the Commission regarding parole for the inmate convicted of the violent crime.

(f) If the inmate was convicted of a [crime of violence as defined under Article 27, § 643B of the Code] VIOLENT CRIME and the victim made a written request for notification under § 4-504 of this subtitle, the Commission shall notify the victim:

(1) That an inmate released on parole has been found guilty of violating a condition of parole; and

(2) Of the punishment imposed for the violation.

(b) (1) In cases where a defendant is sentenced to the Division of Correction, if the victim makes a written request to the Commission for notification and maintains a current address on file with the Commission, the Commission shall notify the victim or designated representative in writing that an inmate is being considered for a:

- (i) Commutation;
- (ii) Pardon; or
- (iii) Remission of sentence.

(2) If the inmate was convicted of a [crime of violence as defined under Article 27, § 643B of the Code] VIOLENT CRIME:

(i) The victim may submit to the Commission a victim impact statement; and

(ii) The Commission shall make the victim impact statement available for the inmate's review subject to § 4-505(b)(2) of this subtitle.

(3) If a victim impact statement or recommendation is submitted under this section, the Commission shall consider the victim impact statement or recommendation.

(4) The victim may request a meeting with a Commission member.
