House Bill 170, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 26, 1994, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 147.

## Uniform Commercial Code - Leases

FOR the purpose of enacting the Maryland Uniform Commercial Code – Leases; defining certain terms; providing for the applicability of certain laws to leases subject to the provisions of this Act; establishing requirements governing the formation and construction of certain lease contracts; providing for the effect and enforceability of certain lease contracts; establishing certain requirements governing the performance of certain parties under certain lease contracts; establishing certain procedures, rights, and remedies applicable to certain defaults under certain lease contracts; making certain conforming changes in certain provisions of Titles 1 and 9 of the Commercial Law Article; altering a certain definition; clarifying that a "terminal rental adjustment clause" in a vehicle lease does not create a sale or security interest; providing for the effective date of this Act; and generally relating to leases of goods.
