

- (3) the economic circumstances of each party at the time the award is to be made;
- (4) the circumstances that contributed to the estrangement of the parties;
- (5) the duration of the marriage;
- (6) the age of each party;
- (7) the physical and mental condition of each party;
- (8) how and when specific marital property or interest in the pension, retirement, profit sharing, or deferred compensation plan, was acquired, including the effort expended by each party in accumulating the marital property or the interest in the pension, retirement, profit sharing, or deferred compensation plan, or both;
- (9) THE CONTRIBUTION BY EITHER PARTY OF PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN § 8-201(E)(3) OF THIS SUBTITLE TO THE ACQUISITION OF REAL PROPERTY HELD BY THE PARTIES AS TENANTS BY THE ENTIRETY.

[(9)](10) any award of alimony and any award or other provision that the court has made with respect to family use personal property or the family home; and

[(10)](11) any other factor that the court considers necessary or appropriate to consider in order to arrive at a fair and equitable monetary award or transfer of an interest in the pension, retirement, profit sharing, or deferred compensation plan, or both.

(c) The court may reduce to a judgment any monetary award made under this section, to the extent that any part of the award is due and owing.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or application to any action filed before the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1994.

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 1280.

House Bill 1280 would authorize the sale of used vehicles that fail the State's safety inspection by use of a "proof of inspection" certificate that lists the vehicle's safety defects. The bill would also place responsibility for obtaining a safety inspection
