(a) The Office shall maintain liaison with both the Maryland and the federal offices of economic opportunity, county and city offices concerned with energy programs, citizen groups, and all other agencies of the State, federal, county, and municipal governments and it shall consult with and advise these local groups on their energy assistance programs and shall work at all levels of government to administer and implement the STATE Energy Assistance and Information PROGRAM Act [and program]. In addition, the Office shall establish liaison with all utility and major fuel vendors in the State and shall seek their advice when developing and implementing the energy assistance program.
