

fuel. The Office shall establish intake procedures for those experiencing an energy emergency and guidelines for the income eligibility and the program eligibility of applicants. [In developing these guidelines, the Office may adopt the procedures of the federal "Emergency Energy Conservation Program" in § 222(a)(12) of the "Community Services Act of 1974".] Local offices for administering the crisis intervention program shall be identified by the Energy Assistance and Information Office. An emergency fund shall be established to pay fuel and utility vendors who have provided service to persons qualifying for the crisis intervention program. The amount of assistance shall be based on need, with a maximum of \$250 per year to any qualifying household. Where possible, all existing assistance programs concerned with energy emergencies shall be administered by the Maryland Office of Economic Opportunity.

**SUBTITLE 4. MARYLAND INSURANCE ADMINISTRATION**

10-401.

The head of the Maryland Insurance Administration is the Maryland Insurance Commissioner who shall:

(1) Be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate; and

(2) Have the rights, powers, duties, obligations, and functions previously exercised by the Insurance Commissioner within the Insurance Division.
