 fifteen barrels of corn, crop of wheat on the ground one canoe, one
 plough, one harrow, three teas teasteads and furniture all
 which property is now in my possession to have and to hold
 the same descental property unto the said John A. Radcliff his executors
 administrators and assigns to his and their only proper use and benefit and
 I the said Thomas Cartmell for myself my executors and
 administrators shall and will warrant and defend
 by these presents to the said John A. Radcliff his executors
 administrators and assigns the said descental property
 against me my executors and administrators and aga
 inst all and every other person or persons who may claim
 in the same or any part thereof In testimony whereof
