 truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves and every of us, our and every of our heirs, execu-
 tors and administrators in the whole and for the whole jointly and severally, firmly by
 these presents, sealed with our seals and dated this third day of May in the year of
 our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three. The condition of the above
 obligation is such that if the above bounden John H. Hodson shall well and faith-
 fully discharge the duties of Treasurer of the Primary Schools of Winchester County
 according to law then the above obligation shall be void, otherwise it is to be and
 remain in full force and virtue in law -

 Phillips do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained and sold and by these
 presents do grant bargain & sell unto the said Samuel Dunnock one negro
 man Jerry aged about twenty three years a slave for life To have and to hold
 the above bargained and sold negro man Jerry to the said Samuel Dunnock
 his heirs and assigns forever. In witness whereof the said John Phillips have
 hereunto set my hand and seal this the 29th day of April 1843.
