 executors admors all and singular the said goods
 and other the premises unto the said Jacob Wilder his
 executors, admors, and assigns against me the said
 William Harper my executors and administrators and
 against all and every other person or persons whatsoever
 shall and will warrant and never defend by these
 presents of all and singular which said goods and
 merchandize and other the premises of the said William
 Harper have put the said Jacob Wilder in full possession
 by delivering to him the said Jacob Wilder one pew knife
 at the sealing and delivering of these presents in the
 name of the whole premises hereby bargained and
 sold or mentioned and intended to be unto him the said
 Jacob Wilder as aforesaid in witness whereof I have hereunto
