



 rent money with legal interest thereon from the date hereof on or before the first day of  
 November next ensuing the date thereof without any deduction or abatement  
 whatsoever then all from thenceforth these presents and every matter and  
 thing therein contained shall cease and be utterly null and void any  
 thing therein to the contrary thereof in any wise notwithstanding  
 In witness whereof the said John Bunting hath hereunto set his hand  
 and affixed his seal this 4th day of October 1843

 the said Henry Page called Pinkens Creek where I now reside To have  
 and to hold the said corn blades & tops above bargained and sold  
 unto the said William Brea adm<sup>r</sup> his heirs executors administrators
