Acknowledged before James Smith

Be it remembered that the following act of Manumission was recorded on the 6th day of December 1843, To wit:
to all whom it may concern be it known that we Ann Page Junr. Charlotte A. H. Page, Ann Page Jr., Elizabeth O. Page and Francis C. Page of the Town of Cambridge in Dorchester County in the State of Maryland for divers good causes and considerations us therunto moving, have released from Slavery, liberated, manumitted and set free, and by these presents do hereby release,

from Slavery, liberate manumit and set free our mulatto man named Silas, being of the age of twenty three years and able to work and gain sufficient livelihood and maintenance, and him the said mulatto man named Silas we do declare to be henceforth free, manumitted and discharged from all manner of service or servitudes to us our executors or administrators forever. In Witness whereof we the said Ann Page Junr., Charlotte A. H. Page, Ann Page Jr., Elizabeth O. Page and Francis C. Page have hereunto set our hands and seals this 5th day of December eighteen hundred and forty three.

Stewart of Dorchester County in the State of Maryland for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and twenty five dollars current money to me in hand paid by Caleb Sheppard of Dorchester County and State aforesaid at and before the reading and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof I
