 head of hog — To have and to hold the said property above described unto the
 said William B. Baile which he is an assignee to his and their only proper use
 benefit, and behoof, and for no other intent or purpose whatsoever
 against him the said Thomas Wingate and his heirs, and against all persons
 whatsoever — On Testimony whereof the said Thomas Wingate has hereunto
 subscribed his name and affixed his seal the sixteenth day of February
 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty four

 aged about twenty years old slave for life and bound in body and mind — To
 have and to hold the said negro girl Mary and also all the personal
 property mentioned in the Bill of Sale from George Applegate to Elizy Lambdin
 as above bargained and sold unto the said George Applegate his heirs executors
 administrators and assigns we do witness enter and Administer and
 and against all and every person or persons shall and will bear and defend
 the Testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands and affixed our
