 benefit, and behoof, and for no other use intent or purpose whatsoever
 against him the said Thomas Wingate and his heirs, and against all persons

 subscribed his name and affixed his seal this sixteenth day of February
 in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty four
