from Ex. } was recorded on the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of April 1844, to wit:  
Thomas Woolford } Know all men by these presents that I Thomas Woolford, for  
divers good causes, have agreed and do hereby agree to man-

umit and set free my Negro Slave Washington, alias Washington Cooper, from and after the 20<sup>th</sup> of April in the year eighteen hundred and fifty, and he is hereby manumitted and liberated from and after the aforesaid time. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal, this 20<sup>th</sup> April eighteen hundred and forty four.

Nancy Campen, have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell, unto the said Nancy Campen, my Negro Woman named Janty, slave for life; To have and to hold the said Negro Woman Janty for her sole use and enjoyment as above bargained and sold unto the said Nancy Campen, her heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, against me the said William A. Sullivan, my heirs, executors and administrators, and against all and every other person or persons, shall & will warrant and defend. In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty fifth day of April 1844.
