 21st day of September Anno Domini 1844 to wit —
 Littleton Hubbert. Know all men by these presents that Littleton Hubbert Negro of
 Dorchester County and State of Maryland for and in consideration of the sum of fifty five Dollars
 current money to me in hand paid by Daniel Hubbert of Caroline County and State aforesaid
 at and before the dealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof I do hereby
 acknowledge have granted bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant
 bargain and sell unto the said Daniel Hubbert his Executors Administrators and
 assigns to wit. one white Cow and calf seven head of hogs Crop of Corn and
 fodder two Mares and a furniture and Cabbages all which property is now in my
 possession — To have and to hold the same described property above bargained and
 sold to the said Daniel Hubbert his Executors Administrators and assigns forever
 to his and their heirs use and benefit. And the said Littleton Hubbert for my self
 my Executors and Administrators shall and will warrant and forever defend
 by these presents to the said Daniel Hubbert his Executors Administrators and
 assigns the said described property against me my Executors and Administrators
 and against all and every person or persons whatsoever claiming the same on
 any part thereof. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
 this 20th day of September 1844

 Washington Hurlock of Dorchester County
 and State of Maryland for and in consideration of the sum of \$ 200.00 two hundred
 Dollars current money to me in hand paid by James Hurlock of the County and
 State aforesaid, at and before the dealing and delivery hereof. the receipt whereof
 I do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained and sold and by these presents
 do grant bargain and sell unto the said James Hurlock his Executors
 administrators and assigns one gray mare called Henry, one black Colt 3 years
 old called Victoria, one Colt about 6 months old, black eight head of Cattle,
 one Cart, four head of hogs and also my Crop of Corn and fodder now growing
 or standing on the Ground, all which property is now in my possession
