Dorchester County and State of Maryland, for and in consideration of the sum Twelve dollars current money, to me in hand paid by Robert Wallaw of the County and State aforesaid, at and before the sealing and delivery hereof, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge; have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain & sell unto the said Robert Wallaw, his executors, administrators and assigns, one Red Steer, one Brindle Steer with a white back, and one Ox Cart, all which property is now in my possession — to have and to hold the same described property above bargained and sold to the said Robert Wallaw his executors, administrators and assigns forever; to his and their only proper use and benefit, and I the said Joshua Harris for myself, my executors and administrators shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents to the said Robert Wallaw, his executors, administrators and assigns, the said described property against me, my executors and administrators, and against all and every other person or persons whomsoever, claiming the same or any part thereof. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the 18th day of November 1844.
