Be it remembered that the following Bond was recorded on the 22^d day of April 1845, to-wit: I know all men by these presents that we William Bell, Henry Bibby and John Parvin, of Dorchester County, in the State of Maryland, are held & firmly bound unto the State of Maryland, in the full and just sum of Two thousand dollars, current money of the United States, to be paid to the said State or its certain Attorney; to the which payment well and truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals and dated this 21 day of April 1845.
