just sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, current Money, on Bill
obligatory, dated the 22nd day of April eighteen hundred and forty five
with interest, on which bill the said Samuel Corkran & William Rea
are securities, and to secure the said Samuel Corkran & William Rea
against loss on account of said Securityship, the said William M. Littleton
is willing to execute these presents. Now this Indenture Witnesseth,
that the said William M. Littleton, for and in consideration of the prom-
ises, and for and in consideration of the sum of five dollars, current
Money, to him in hand paid by the said Samuel Corkran & William Rea,
at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof
the said William M. Littleton doth hereby acknowledge, and thereof
and therefrom doth acquit, release, remanate and forever discharge the
said Samuel Corkran & William Rea, their heirs, executors & administrators.
