presents do grant, bargain and sell unto the said Virginia A. Crockett,  
her executors, administrators and assigns, one Negro Girl Ann Maria,  
a Slave for life, aged six weeks. To have and to hold the said  
described Negro Girl Ann Maria to the said Virginia A. Crockett  
her executors, administrators and assigns forever; and he the said  
for his heirs, executors and administrators, the  
said Charles Willingman unto the said Virginia A. Crockett, her execu-  
tors, administrators and assigns against him the said Charles Willingman  
his executors and administrators, and against all and every other person  
or persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by
