Stewart of Dorchester County, I have bargained, sold & delivered to said Stewart my printing Establishment, now in the Town of Cambridge, including the Press, Type, Fixtures and appertinances of every description, together with all the profits of the establishment, and the debts now due to the newspaper called the Democrat, and clear of all incumbrances, and I hereby declare and warrant that I have a full and clear title to the said articles, and I warrant the title to the same. To have and to hold the said property to the said James A. Stewart and his heirs and assigns forever. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 16<sup>th</sup> Dec. 1845.
