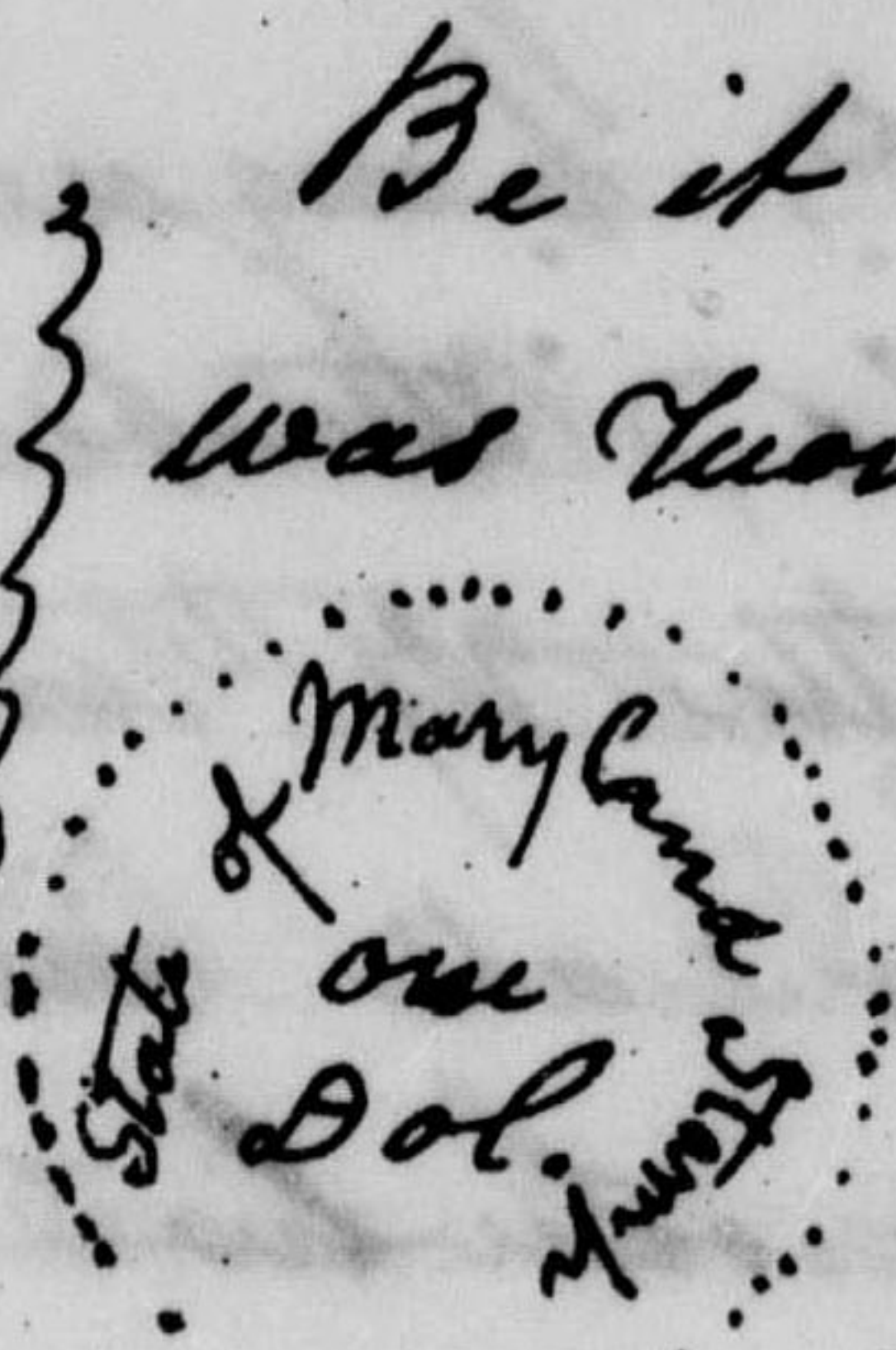


The interlineations in the above Bill of Sale commencing in the eighteenth line after the word sale made before the signing and sealing of these presents.

Be it remembered that the following Bond was recorded on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of June 1846 -

Know all men by these presents that we Sovereign S. Dawson, Daniel Cannon and Charles J. Smith, of Dorchester County

in the State of Maryland, are held and firmly bound unto the State of Maryland in the full and just sum of Two thousand dollars, current money of the United States, to be paid to the said State, or its certain attorney, to the which payment well and truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and Administrators jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals and dated this 1<sup>st</sup> day of June 1846.

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bounden Sovereign S. Dawson shall well and truly execute the Office of Constable of Election District No. 2, in all things appertaining thereto, and shall also well and truly account for all moneys placed in his hands for Collection, and shall also well and truly pay all sums of Money received by him, then the above obligation to be void, otherwise of full force & virtue in Law.
