Entry of Slave
Bill Jarvis

Be it remembered that the following Entry of Slave was recorded on the 23. day of December 1846.
Maryland, Doughster County, to Wit: I hereby Certify to all manner of persons whom it doth or may concern that being seized and possessed of a certain Negro Slave called Bill Jarvis in right of my Wife called Julia, aged about fifty one years, and being desirous to remove & bring the said Negro Bill Jarvis from Matthews County in the State of Virginia, within the State of Maryland, and in the County of Doughster County, for my own use and benefit and not for sale do make out this Certificate of the said Bill Jarvis agreeably to the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided. Witness my hand and seal this thirtieth day of November 1846.
